PSYCHOLOGY

Learn about yourself and others by earning your degree in Psychology. This program includes coursework and practical experience that prepares you to enter the workforce, pursue master's level work, or continue on to your doctoral degree.

Hands-On Experiential Learning

Internships

The Internship Program enables students to obtain work experience and make informed career choices through supervised internships of a semester or more in length.

Job Shadowing

Students can engage in job shadowing with one or more licensed counselors or other professionals for a one-week period during the spring or summer of their sophomore year. This experience will take place at South Central Human Services, the North Dakota State Hospital, or other approved locations.

Practicum

Students who concentrate on Addiction Counseling will apply to a 960-hour NDBACE-approved training practicum. After successful completion you will be eligible to sit for a licensure exam in North Dakota.

Begin your Journey to Success

We prepare you for the future in ways other schools don't. We call our approach the Journey to Success, and it defines all we do here. This experience includes four phases that develop students on a holistic basis, both personally and professionally:

- **Look Inward:** Examine your own interests, strengths, and goals.

Program Features

We offer two degree tracks in Psychology:

- **Bachelor of Arts**

The Bachelor of Arts degree provides students with a solid grounding in psychological theory, research, and application. It is designed for students who will enter the workforce after graduation, or for students wishing to pursue graduate work in applied psychology at the master's level (such as counseling) or in a related field (such as occupational therapy or social work).

- **Bachelor of Science**

The Bachelor of Science track is designed for students who will be pursuing doctoral degrees in some area of psychological research or clinical psychology. This track places greater emphasis on research, experimental design, and statistical analysis that culminates in the senior thesis.

As a Psychology student at the University of Jamestown, you will benefit from:

- Annual research symposium plus opportunities to present at regional professional conferences
- Local internship and career opportunities
- Active Psi Chi chapter and Student Psychology Association
- Faculty committed to both classroom teaching and mentoring students in conducting research
